

Disciplinary Procedures

Going Forward the Troop will use a very simple set of disciplinary rules. Scouts are expected to use the Scout Oath and Law as their "**personal code of conduct**" when involved in any Troop activity. If a Scout chooses to be unruly during a meeting or other activity he will be removed and his parents will be called to come and take him home. This applies for campouts as well. The Scout will be allowed to return to Troop activities after a conference with his parents, the Scoutmaster, and the leader who removed him from the activity is held.

Fighting and hazing **will absolutely not be tolerated**. A first offense will bring a warning and possibly removal from the activity. A Scout guilty of a second offense will be suspended from the Troop for a period of time to be determined by the Troop's uniformed leadership. The decision to allow a scout to return to the Troop at a later date will be made on a case-by-case basis.

It is also the Troop Leadership's hope that we do not have to expand this section of the handbook knowing that the majority of incoming Scouts already know and abide by the principles of Scouting in their daily lives.
